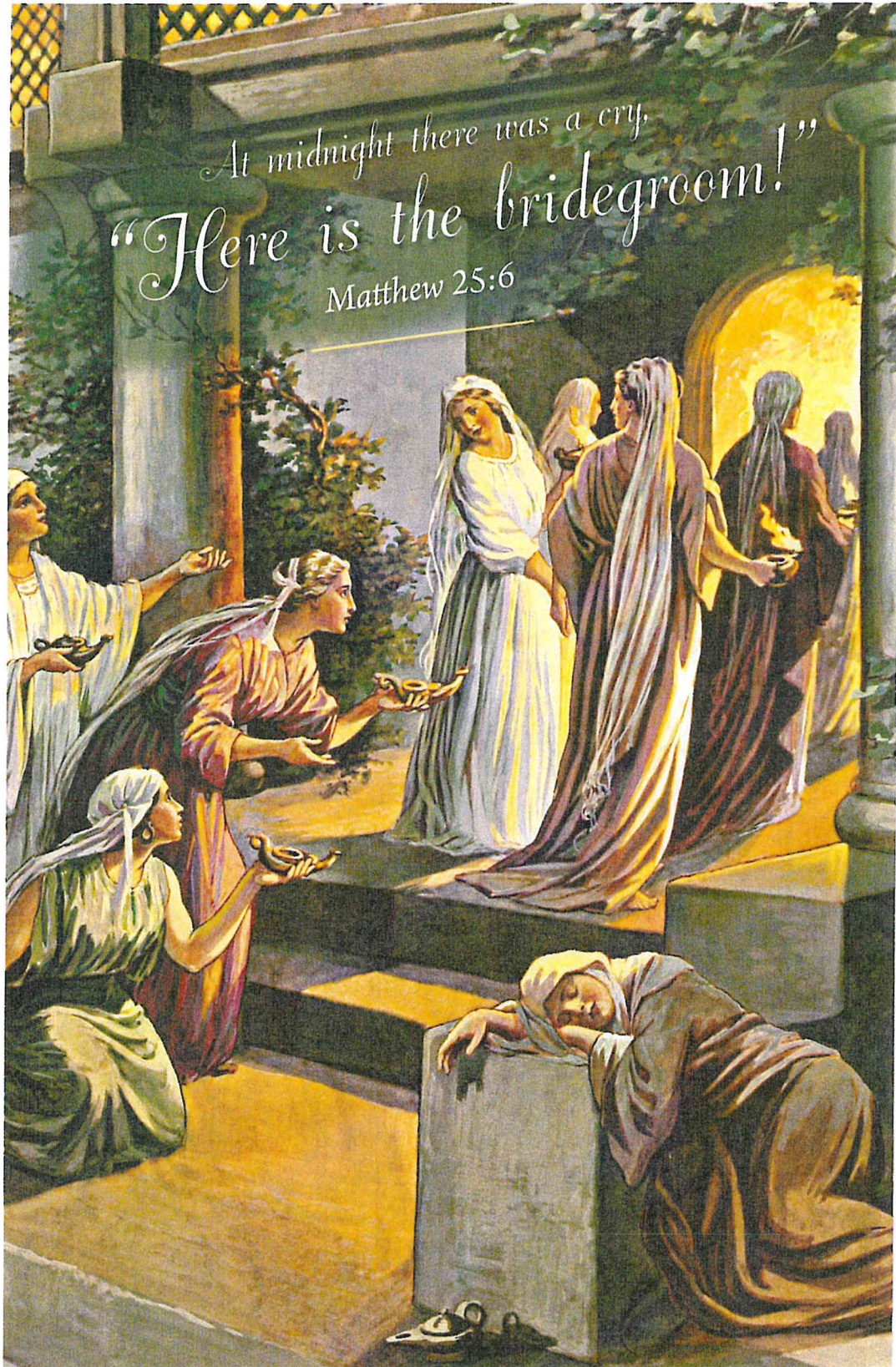

AS WE GATHER



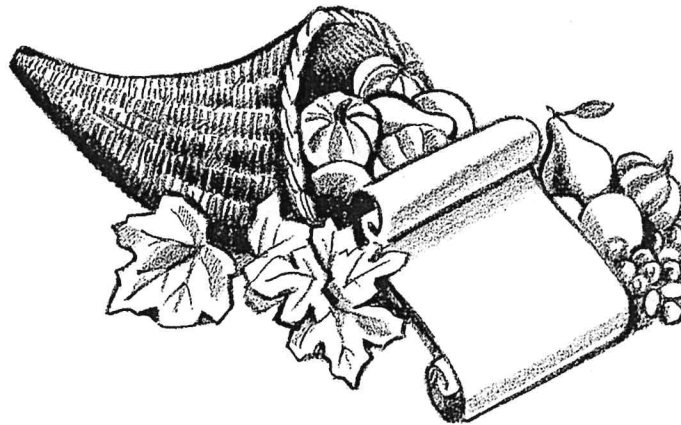
