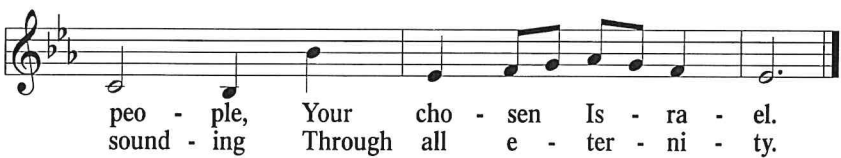
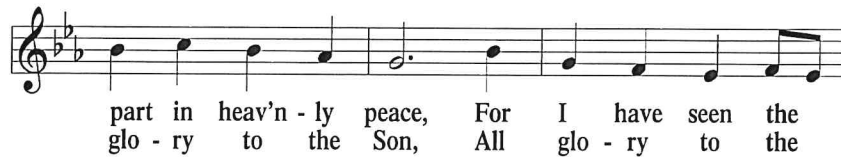

We welcome Deaconess Pamela Boehle-Silva and Rev. Peter Ledic as guest speakers at our Bible Class and Worship Service today.

Pastor Binz will be at the District Pastors' Conference from April 30th through May 2nd.



The roots of Always Mercy were planted in 2006 when Pamela Boehle-Silva, RN, from Rocklin, California, was invited by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) to educate church workers, specifically deaconesses, on HIV-AIDS awareness, treatment and prevention. Tragically, many with this diagnosis or even a hint of that horrible “skinny disease” were shunned by their families, their village, and even their church. In Kenya, shame and stigma are very real experiences for those who are visibly ill. Even from her first visit in 2006 and subsequent visits, it became evident to Pamela that the need for care extended far beyond HIV-AIDS. Many Kenyans suffer needlessly from pain, chronic but treatable illnesses, or untreatable, terminal illnesses.

Throughout her years of travel to Kenya, Deaconess Pamela was acutely aware of the need for compassionate care for those suffering in body and soul due to chronic, serious illnesses. In 2022, she and her husband, Dennis founded Always Mercy, a U.S. based nonprofit dedicated to bringing Christ-centered care to those in need. Currently, Always Mercy supports the building of Rehema Hospice and Clinic in Kenya.

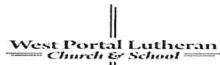
