THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

The pastors receive ashes first, followed by the congregation. The pastors place the ashes on the forehead of each person in the sign of the cross, saying:

*Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.
After receiving the ashes, each person returns to his or her place in silence.*

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their baptism.

OLD TESTAMENT

Joel 2:12-19

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. EPISTLE

2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you,
and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.
